Statement of Audited Financial Results for the quarter and year ended 31st March, 2021

#### Notes:

1. These financial results have been prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards (ind AS) as prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India. The above financial results of the Company for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2021 has been reviewed by the Audit committee and approved by the Board of Directors at their meeting held on 28th June, 2021.

2. The Company is in appeal against the Customs duty demand for Rs.1282 lakh pertaining to the year 1994-95 before the Hon'ble Supreme Court and the matter is pending with the Hon'ble Supreme Court. The custom duty demand liability and interest liability thereon has been provided in the account books in the financial year 2015-16. Final liability would be determined on the disposal of the appeal by the Hon'ble Supreme Court.

3. Exceptional Items for the current year includes a sum of Rs. Nil (Previous year : 123.66 Lakh ) towards due to diminution in value old stock, a sum of Rs. Nil (Previous Year: Rs. 20.72 Lakh ) towards disposed off plant & machinery due to obsolete/non working condition and Rs. 3.76 Lakh (Previous year Rs. Nil) towards loss on sale of fixed assets.

4. During the current financial year, the company has ended up with all the existing lease agreements with the lessors. Therefore, the lease liabilities and right of use assets recognised by the company in earlier years in accordance with Ind-AS 116 are now been disposed off in the books of accounts. The corresponding profits/loss on disposal of lease liabilities and right of use assets has been recognised in the Statement of Profits and Loss.

5. The Company has incurred loss of Rs.153.15 lakh (previous year Rs. 902.83 lakh) during the year and has accumulated losses of Rs.5653.10 Lakh (Previous year Rs. 5499.95 Lakh) as at March 31, 2021, resulting in erosion of its net worth, these factors raise doubts about going concern status of the company. The management in view of its continuing business operation and explore other avenues is confident of generating cash flows to fund the operating and capital requirements of the Company. Accordingly, these statements have been prepared on a going concern basis.

6. The Company's operating segments are established on the basis of those components of the Company that are evaluated regularly by the Chief Operating Decision Maker (as defined in Ind AS 108 - 'Operating Segments') in deciding how to allocate resources and in assessing performance. These have been identified taking into account nature of products and services, the differing risks and returns and the internal business reporting systems. The Company has only one operating and reporting segment, which is manufacturing and dealing in Readymade Garments/Textile. Accordingly, the amounts appearing in these financial statements relate to this primary business segment. Further, bother we trade only in India and accordingly, no disclosures are required under secondary segment reporting.





7. The outbreak of corona virus (COVID-19) pandemic globally and in India has caused since previous year and is causing significant disturbance and slowdown of economic activity. The Company's operations and revenue during the period were impacted due to COVID-19. Formal wear market has taken a big hit with work from home change. The Company has generated revenue from retailing of garments and is exploring other avenues to seek revenue. The Company has taken into account the possible impact of COVID-19 in preparation of the unaudited standalone financial results, including its assessment of recoverable value of its assets based on internal and external information upto the date of approval of these unaudited standalone financial results and current indicators of future economic conditions. Further, the company will continue to closely monitor any material changes to future economic conditions.

8. Revenue for the quarter includes sale of goods amounting to Rs.40.10 lakh (during the year Rs.44.39 Lakh) to trade payable settlement of amount outstanding.

9. The Code on Social Security, 2020 ('Code') relating to employee benefits during employment and post-employment benefits received Presidential assent in September 2020. The Code has been published in the Gazette of India. However, the date on which the Code will come into effect has not been notified. The Company will assess the impact of the Code when it comes into effect and will record any related impact in the period the Code becomes effective.

10. Figures for the quarter ended 31st March,2021 are the balancing figures between audited figures in respect of the full financial year and the unaudited published figures upto the period ended 31st December 2020, which are subject to limited review by the statutory auditor.

11. The figures for the corresponding period of the previous year have been regrouped/rearranged, and/or recast, wherever required.

# **Report on Audit of the Financial Results**

# 1. Opinion

We have audited the accompanying statement of quarterly and year to date financial results of **Meyer Apparel Limited** ("the Company"), for the quarter and year ended on 31<sup>st</sup> March 2021 (the "Statement") attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirements of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended (the "Listing Agreement").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the statement:

- a. is presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations; and
- b. gives a true and fair view in conformity with the applicable accounting standards and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the net profit and other comprehensive loss and other financial information of the Company for the quarter ended March 31, 2021 and of the net loss and other comprehensive loss and other financial information of the Company for the year ended March 31, 2021.

# 2. Basis of Opinion

We conducted our audit of the statement in accordance with the Standards on Auditing ("SA"s) specified under Section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013, as amended ("the Act"). Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India ("ICAI") together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the Financial Statements under the provisions of the Act and the Rules thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the ICAI's Code of Ethics. 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### 3. Material Uncertainty Related to Going Concern

We draw attention to note no. 5 of the statement, wherein the Company has incurred a net loss of Rs. 153.15 Lakhs during the year and the accumulated losses as at March 31, 2021 amounted to Rs. 5653.10 Lakhs, resulting in, the erosion of its net worth and has current liabilities in excess of current assets by Rs. 2817.49 Lakhs as at March 31, 2021. These factors raise doubts that the Company will not be able to continue as a going concern. The management is confident of generating cash flows from continue business operations to fund its operating and capital fund requirements. In view of the above, the financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis. Our report is not qualified in respect of this matter.

# 4. Management's Responsibility for the Financial Results

The Statement has been prepared on the basis of the annual financial statements. The Board of Directors of the Company are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the Statement that gives a true and fair view of the net profit and other comprehensive loss for the quarter and net loss and other comprehensive loss for the year of the Company and other financial information in accordance with the applicable accounting standards prescribed under Section 133 of the Act read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and in compliance with Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and the design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the Statement that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the Statement, the Board of Directors are responsible for assessing the Company's ability, to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the Board of Directors either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.
